

Information Which May Be Refused

The HKSI will consider disclosure of information taking into account the public interest factors as weighed against any possible risk of harm or prejudice.

The HKSI may refuse to disclose information, or to confirm or deny the existence of information, in the following categories:

1 *Market Sensitive Information*

Information received in confidence from and conveyed in confidence to or from other parties, sports authorities and international organisations.

2 *Law Enforcement, Legal Proceedings and Legal Restrictions*

Information the disclosure of which would harm or prejudice the administration of law enforcement, legal proceedings, legal advice and related privileged information.

3 *Management and Operation of HKSI*

- (a) Information the disclosure of which would harm or prejudice the HKSI's negotiating positions or contractual activities; competitive or financial position or property interests; HKSI's operations and management of its partners, staff and Scholarship Athletes; information relating to the conduct of tests, research information or data, management reviews, examinations, audits, etc.
- (b) Information the disclosure of which would harm or prejudice the security of HKSI properties and premises.
- (c) Information the disclosure of which would harm or prejudice the employment and management of HKSI staff.

4 *Others*

- (a) Information which could only be made available by unreasonable or substantial diversion of HKSI's resources; or in a particular form which is not currently available.
- (b) Information whose disclosure would be deemed a breach of Data Protection Principles in accordance with the Personal Data (Privacy) Ordinance (http://www.pcpd.org.hk/english/data_privacy_law/ordinance_at_a_Glance/ordinance.html) to protect the privacy of the individual.
